

Examples of non-legislative procedures involving EU institutions:

<p>European Council</p> <p>The European Council acts alone.</p>	<p>E.g.:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Art. 31 TEU: CFSP decisions; • Art. 236 TFEU: configurations and presidency of the Council of Ministers.
<p>Council of Ministers</p> <p>The Council of Ministers acts alone.</p>	<p>E.g.:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Article 31 TEU: decisions within the framework of the CFSP.
<p>Commission</p> <p>The Commission acts alone.</p>	<p>E.g.:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Art. 106 (3) TFEU: undertakings with a special position; • Arts. 290 and 291 TFEU: delegated powers.
<p>Council of Ministers and Commission</p> <p>The Council and the Commission act together.</p>	<p>E.g.:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Art. 31 TFEU: Common Customs Tariff; • Art. 242 TFEU: rules governing the committees provided for in the Treaties.
<p>Commission, social partners, Council of Ministers, social partners procedure</p> <p>EU implementation of Framework Agreements of the European social partners.</p>	<p>E.g.:</p> <p>Arts. 154 and 155 TFEU: social law.</p>
